## 5 minutes with... Vincent Van Duysen

The designer, architect and king of minimalism shares the thought process behind his 'Flora' tapware for Fantini

How would you define the style of this new tapware for Fantini? My desire was to create a timeless collection with a subtly nostalgic nod. It's more of an industrial-chic aesthetic that's been interpreted through

An early glimpse of the collection was previewed last year, has anything changed between then and now? We only revealed a fraction of the collection's true essence. When designing the full offering, my team and I recognised the design's great potential to adapt to a wide range of spaces and decorative styles. That's why we developed a more comprehensive range that includes three distinct handle options [a curved crosshead design, sloping single lever and double lever], allowing each user to best shape the atmosphere they wish to create in their bathroom. In fact, it's the handles that take centre-stage, exuding a strong allure and character that cements these designs as tactile and ergonomic. Why did you name the collection 'Flora'? It's actually the name of my dog [she and Van Duysen's other dachshund Pablo are often photographed in his projects], but the tap designs also have a clear link to nature and organic shapes.
